Child and Family Programs

Eligibility and Intake

- At least one child in the household is between the ages of 0-4 years old
- Vulnerable, low income families in marginalized neighborhoods/environment
- Program is offered to families across Toronto
- Parent is having difficulty providing care for child and has no other means of support
- Newcomers who face isolation or may otherwise struggle to feel part of their community.

Support for Families in Crisis

Short-term in-home childcare support for families with children (who are 0-4 years old and are at home full-time) who need hands-on care while parents are recovering following a hospital discharge, medical emergency or crisis situation.

Support for Families in Crisis allows parents to:

- Have a timely recovery from illness or crisis.
- Access community resources for ongoing support.
- Have peace of mind in knowing their child is being well cared for.

Home Support Services

This service is available to assist families with young children (0-4 years old). Services are provided in clients' homes while parent(s) are recuperating from surgery or other medical situation.

Skilled and trained workers in home management provide short-term services:

- Help to maintain a clean, safe, and healthy environment.
- Perform duties such as light housekeeping, laundry, meal preparation or other duties as needed.
- Prepare healthy nutrition meals, snack, school luncheons, etc.

Parent Relief and Connect

This program offers short-term in-home support for parents at risk of or are experiencing PPD, mental health issues and/or isolation. This program assists parents in need of temporary relief from the demands of childcare for kids who are 0-4 years old and are at home full-time.

Parent Relief and Connect allows parents to:

- Focus on their own self care.
- Attend support groups and counselling, parenting classes or medical appointments.
- Connect with their community.
- Get much needed rest and sleep.

Scarborough Perinatal Support Network

Toronto Public Health partners with VHA Home HealthCare, TAIBU, and other community agencies to offer a Postpartum Support Group to parents who are having emotional challenges.

VHA provides in-home Child Minders as an option to allow parents to attend this support group at TAIBU Community Centre.
